




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

The total area destroyed by the fire disaster in Kostanay Region exceeded 43,000 hectares of forest and adjacent territories in September 2022.

AlmaU has organised humanitarian help (mostly food products) for those affected by the fire: 90 residential buildings in two settlements and 2091 evacuated people.



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
BOLASHAQ PROGRAMME

ALMAU CLEAN WATER FACILITIES

AlmaU gives free access to clean water offering Campus facilities for students, faculty, staff & guests.

University has 2 drinking fountains on the premises along with the drinking water boilers. Water here comes from a filter system containing 3 stages of purification and cleaning.





Filtration systems specially designed for catering and canteen services. Water consumption is regulated via the montly bills received from the central city water system. AlmaU Campus is connected to central city water system that is fed by naturally clean mountain glaciers that surround Almaty city.

Sectional toilet flush mechanisms are installed in most of toilet rooms on campus. Students and staff are encouraged to save water.

AlmaU central sewage system is connected with the Almaty city. Central city sewage system has bio and mechanical multistage filtration.

On-campus cleaning services use certified ecofriendly washing liquids and bioproducts.

Staff and students are encouraged to save water, therefore sanitizers are placed in all public places around the campus.



All staff sign 1–3 year employment contracts.

AlmaU has a number of policies that ensure safety, nondiscrimination, equal pay, commitment to no-forced labour. Students have the opportunity for job placements on campus and are support by the Career centre to find employment or internships.

SERVICE LEARNING

<u>Service Learning</u> (SL) course is a unique example of the Third Mission realization by Kazakhstan university. Although the case of the Service Learning course is unique in Kazakhstan, there are many approaches of SL realization around the globe. AlmaU partners in different parts of the world have their own vision of community service and service learning concepts. In the Fall Semester of 2015, AlmaU, first time in Kazakhstan, launched a new and original educational program oriented for first-year bachelor students compulsory for all specialties and majors – SL. This chapter discuss in greater detail SL educational program of AlmaU. The major goal of SL educational program is to achieve greater efficiency serving the community through additional mobilization of efforts, increasing the scale and degree of student engagement, going "beyond the walls" of the University.

School of Politics and Law of AlmaU, standing for the realization of the Third Mission, provides the SL educational program to train and educate AlmaU students to design and implement impactful, community-oriented projects. In partnership with civic society, representatives of NGOs and government authorities, SL program seeks to promote training in the field of community services and prepare students to become professionals and responsible citizens of the country.

AlmaU is technically equipped to receive students, faculty and staff with disabilities. AlmaU has equal pay policy towards employees with disabilities. AlmaU hosts students from low-income countries for exchange and full-time studies. they are supported by the hosting teams in terms finding the best available accommodation, fellow students gather warm clothes for those who cannot afford it through student charity club.

During their studies, students get through the main concepts and definitions of Sustainable Development Goals encouraged by UN, human rights and inclusiveness.

Currently, SL educational program has more than 30 partners, 150 realized impactful projects, more than 50 thousand hours of project work. In 2017, SL educational program was awarded CEEMAN Champions Awards in nomination "The Responsible Management Education".

Since 2015, 4200+ students & faculty have been working with 30+ NGO partners & implemented 100+ community service projects, 50 000+ hours of volunteering activity. Service learning bases on long-term project development tutored by AlmaU faculty. Some samples of the projects run by AlmaU students are the following:

CENTER FOR URBAN STUDIES AND CITY MANAGEMENT

In 2020, the <u>Center for Urban Studies</u> and City Management was created and in 2020–2021 academic year this brand new program Urban studies and city management was developed and delivered by the Center. AlmaU launched a new programme (Social partnership in city management, Urban public policy). Levels of study: UG (Bachelor in Business and Management). The programmes' purpose is the formation and development of students' competencies in the field of city management and urban agglomerations, as well as professional knowledge in the field of urban studies. Urban studies is a science field dedicated to the development of urban systems and studying the structure, territorial and socio-economic organization and processes of life of the city.

APPLIED RESEARCH & PROFESSIONAL TALKS

UC Field Studies – field researches conducted by the students of Urban Center made to identify the problems and build the **metrics of Kazakhstani cities**.

In 2022 AlmaU supported public discussions **"Guidelines for involving the population in the improvement processes"**, developed by the Desent Public Foundation together with AlmaU Urban Center. Urban Talks Organizers: Association of Urbanists of Kazakhstan Q88 together with the Center for Urban Studies. The Urban Talks discussion platform has appeared six years ago in Almaty as a space for iiscussion of the current city agenda.

An **Investment attraction strategy** for Almaty city was developed by AlmaU and adopted by the Mayor's Office of Almaty. 

ALMAU'S COLLABORATION WITH LEHIGH UNIVERSITY

AlmaU and Lehigh University started a fruitful collaboration via joint project development activity, with the participation of students and teachers of both institutions. In the frame of the Global Social Impact Fellowship, supported by the U.S. Embassy and funded by UniCEN – Central Asia University Partnerships Program which is implemented by the American Councils for International Education in Kazakhstan, more than 20 students and several faculty members of the two Universities have worked together to implement sustainable development education projects.

The main goal of the competition is to support the initiatives and innovative projects of Kazakhstani youth to develop technological solutions in the field of digitalization.

AlmaU School of Entrepreneurship and Innovation hosts regular Student challenges for them to present their start-up ideas, and one of the main criteria is that the start-up should aim at some kind of climate action and environmental protection. Sudents should understand the UN SDGs, and how thei can solve them with their start up. * * *

ENVIRONMENTAL <u>PROJECT "ULY BALQASH SHAQYRADY"</u> (IN KAZAKH: GREAT BALQASH LAKE IS CALLING)

Following the idea of an Impactful University, AlmaU focuses on enriching its third mission to contribute to the creation of environmental value beyond its campus. "Uly Balqash Shaqyrady" (In Kazakh: Great Balqash Lake is calling) project is aimed to preserve the nature and fauna of Lake Balqash, which is the 15th largest lake in the world. It is unique, because its western part is fresh water, and the eastern half is saline. The goal of this environmental campaign is to attract public attention to the problems of pollution and ecological damage of the Lake and to boost domestic tourism. The project is implemented with support from domestic companies and the Kazakhstan Geographic Society. The icy trips "Uly Balqash Shagyrady" headed by Dr. Kozhakhmetov, AlmaU President, usually take place in winter. The idea is based on a 24 km long walk across the lake by businessmen, journalists, athletes, public leaders and students who have a chance to network and share their insights on various societal topics. This project is aimed at lake conservation and sustainable use of the lake and surrounding area resources and to promote the minimization of damage to aquatic ecosystem

- Waste reduction in the mountain area


ALMAU & SCIENCE FUND'S JOINT PROJECTS ACTIVITY
