

Almaty Management University (AlmaU) is an entrepreneurial and socially responsible university striving to become more comprehensive and research-oriented. In 2025, AlmaU celebrates 37 years of excellence in education — as Kazakhstan's oldest private university, the first business school in the country, and a pioneer of business education in the CIS region.

Building on its entrepreneurial heritage, AlmaU integrates global best practices in responsible management, innovation, and sustainability. The university cooperates with more than 130 universities and associations worldwide, fostering international collaboration, academic mobility, and cross-border research. AlmaU is committed to the Third Mission of universities, the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and the Principles for Responsible Management Education (UN PRME), embedding them across its strategy, education, and operations.

AlmaU includes 10 Schools, 3 Centers, the Institute for Education Development, and AlmaU Extension, its executive education hub. The university offers programs in over 20 disciplines — from business, economics, and law to digital technologies, entrepreneurship, creative industries, and health sciences — delivered in Kazakh, Russian, and English.

Today, AlmaU unites more than 5,200 students, with 75% undergraduate and 25% postgraduate learners. 


Learning has no age limits: Al course for seniors at AlmaU

AlmaU emphasizes the use of local suppliers, environmentally friendly products, and waste-minimization practices throughout its operations. Food is prepared and served in full compliance with Kazakhstan's food-safety legislation, sanitary regulations, and state standards. The policy also requires continuous monitoring of food quality, responsible sourcing, and employee accountability for food and environmental safety.

By embedding nutrition sustainable principles into daily campus life, **AlmaU** strengthens community well-being and reduces environmental footprint. AlmaU connects with society through learning service, and support

The course "Service Learning" is a unique project of the School of Politics and Law for the country; charity events are organized by the student clubs DOS, Remus and SDG Legion.

The university also organizes public lectures and conferences, attracting experts and practitioners, which creates a platform for the exchange of knowledge and experience. These events promote the development of critical thinking and broaden the horizons of participants, which is especially important in a rapidly changing world.

AlmaU is actively involved in educational activities outside the campus, through various initiatives. They conduct weekly career guidance rounds of schools in order to assist applicants in choosing a specialty and university for admission. 


AlmaU Launches Digital Literacy Courses for Senior Citizens in Partnership with the Connect-Ed Public Foundation

In spring 2023, Almaty Management University (AlmaU) hosted digital literacy courses for senior citizens, organized in partnership with the Connect-Ed Public Foundation. The foundation provides free training for both children and older adults, helping them adapt to the rapidly changing digital world and gain essential technology skills for everyday life.

As part of this collaboration, AlmaU and Connect-Ed also launched an initiative to collect outdated electronic devices, remove unnecessary software, and upgrade equipment for reuse. The restored devices were distributed to schoolchildren from low-income families, enabling greater access to digital learning tools.

Supporting equality and opportunity through social and labor policies



The social development policy of the Republic of Kazakhstan is aimed at ensuring a high standard of living for the entire population. It reflects the state's strategic priorities in reforming labor and social relations, healthcare, education, and social protection systems, with a focus on creating conditions that enable citizens to balance family responsibilities and employment.

In accordance with this policy, Article 99 of the Labor Code of the Republic of Kazakhstan guarantees the rights of both parents, not only working women, to flexible forms of employment and childcare leave. Paragraph 3 of Article 82 also establishes the right to intra-shift and special breaks for working women and fathers (including adoptive parents) with children under the age of one and a half years.

alignment with national social responsibility principles, Management University provides support to its employees and their families through financial and educational benefits. The main rules for receiving, retaining, and renewing grants and discounts are set out in the Educational Grants and Discounts Regulations of the institution and apply for the entire duration of study to all university employees and their close relatives.

A research project led by Associate Professor Anna Lipovka from AlmaU has received grant funding from the Committee of Science of the Ministry of Science and Higher Education of the Republic of Kazakhstan under the "Zhas Galym" program.

The project, titled "Development of a Conceptual Model of Leadership Competencies of Managers in Kazakhstan through the Lens of Gender Potential" is being implemented from 2024 to 2026.

The research focuses on advancing gender-inclusive approaches to leadership development and strengthening the scientific capacity of young scholars in Kazakhstan.

AlmaU promotes clean water and sustainable sanitation on campus

AlmaU actively contributes to the achievement of Sustainable Development Goal 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation), which focuses on ensuring access to safe water and sanitation for all. The university provides free drinking fountains and water boilers across the campus. The water is purified through a three-stage filtration system, creating comfortable conditions for students and staff and highlighting the importance of sustainable resource use.

Filtration systems are specially installed in catering facilities and canteens, while water consumption is monitored through monthly bills from the central city water supply system. Most campus restrooms are equipped with sectional flushing devices, and both students and employees are encouraged to conserve water.

The AlmaU Central Sewerage System is connected to the Central Urban Sewerage System of Almaty, which operates multi-stage bio-mechanical filtration. Only certified, environmentally friendly detergents and biological cleaning agents are used on campus, further supporting environmental sustainability.


AlmaU promotes energy efficiency and innovation for sustainability

AlmaU has fully transitioned to energy-efficient practices to reduce its environmental footprint. The university now uses only energysaving LED lighting, and light sensors are installed in all restrooms. A phased replacement of air conditioners with inverter models, which consume less electricity, is also underway. To further optimize energy use, office printers have been replaced with shared printers located on each floor of the university building, minimizing cartridge waste. Staff members follow energy-saving practices in their offices by turning off lights when natural daylight is sufficient and switching off all electrical equipment at the end of the workday.

In partnership with the National Academy of Sciences of the Republic of Kazakhstan and the Thunderbird School of Global Management (Arizona State University), AlmaU's Technology Commercialization Center hosted presentation of the project "CleanO2 Modular Units Based on STEXS Adsorbent." The event introduced students and city residents to innovative solutions aimed at supporting the commercialization of R&D projects.

The program focused on applied research in agriculture, medicine, sustainable development, and mining and mineral processing, providing a unique platform to promote and scale scientific innovation.


AlmaU ensures fair, safe, and supportive working conditions

AlmaU's working conditions comply with the standards of national legislation, are guided by the best human resources and organizational practices. The work environment and culture include:

- · A team of professionals and like-minded people
- · High requirements for the quality of teaching

- · Academic freedom
- Knowledge generation beyond academic disciplines

AlmaU has about 500 protected jobs. Precautions and safe working conditions are provided on campus. AlmaU adheres to a number of principles that ensure safety, non-discrimination, equal pay and non-forced labor. Students have the opportunity to find a job on campus, and the Career Center supports them in employment and internships, and AlmaU is also recognized as a leader in the level of demand for graduates among employers. Employees have the opportunity to earn more than their official salary by teaching and participating in research and other projects. 10-15% of AlmaU employees are university graduates. AlmaU has commissioners (Ombudsman) on human rights for staff, teachers and students. These people advocate for fair work, ethics and workers' rights. An appeal procedure is provided for all issues that can be resolved peace.









AlmaU hosted a student business project fair

On April 3, 2025, Almaty Management University (AlmaU) held AlmaU Store Day — an annual fair of young entrepreneurs, where students present products of their own production created during their studies at the university.

This year, the AlmaU Store Day platform featured 16 student projects, including 4 startups from other universities. Visitors could purchase designer clothing and accessories, assorted dried fruit sets, homemade pastries, and desserts prepared by the students themselves.



For students, participating in the fair became not only an opportunity to earn money but also a valuable experience — from communicating with customers to managing finances and promoting their product. Most of the student projects were developed within the course "Entrepreneurship in Action," designed by the School of Entrepreneurship and Innovation.









AlmaU's Impact on Rural and Professional Education

AlmaU strives to become a comprehensive world-class university with a strong focus on STEM education. Strategic partnerships with industry are seen as essential for advancing research, fostering innovation, and developing university spin-offs.

The School of Tourism and Hospitality at AlmaU offers dual programs with leading global hotels - Rixos, Rahat Palace (Hyatt), and The Ritz-Carlton - as well as dual degrees with the Swiss Education Group, providing students with internships at prestigious hotel chains across Europe.

The AlmaU Media and Film School, located at Kazakhfilm - Kazakhstan's largest film studio - was launched in partnership with Qazaqfilm. The joint program "Digital Filmmaking" includes dual training, shared projects, and access to Qazaqfilm's facilities, offering students hands-on experience and scholarships.

For more than 14 years, AlmaU has been contributing to rural education. The establishment of Zeynep Multidisciplinary College in the North Kazakhstan region strengthens human capital and supports regional development. This initiative seeks to enhance local living standards and



reduce urban migration by promoting accessible, high-quality education in rural areas. Zeynep College is designed as a modern, innovative, multidisciplinary educational hub — a center of community attraction and a catalyst for entrepreneurial activity. The college aims to nurture highly skilled specialists with entrepreneurial mindsets, strong moral values, and legal literacy. The regional government plans to develop the Imantau-Shalkar resort area to the level of the Burabay resort, enhancing tourism infrastructure and service quality. Zeynep College will play a key role in training specialists in management, hospitality, and restaurant services to meet the growing needs of the region's tourism sector.

Integrating Science, Education, and Innovation for Sustainable Urban Development

Modern megacities face a complex range of challenges related to urbanization, climate change, traffic congestion, and air pollution. Finding solutions requires the integration of academic expertise, innovative technologies, and effective collaboration among government, business, and society.

One of the key international platforms in this field is Tomorrow City Shanghai - part of the Smart City Expo World Congress, which serves as a catalyst for knowledge exchange and the promotion of best practices in sustainable urban development. Kazakhstan was represented at the forum by a delegation from Almaty Management University (AlmaU).

The university presented its project Green and Safe Streets, aimed at implementing tactical solutions in urban planning systems. The Green and Safe Streets project won in the "Outstanding **Smart** Infrastructure Project." A special award was also given to an innovative development by Dinmukhamed Ushpayev, a graduate of the **Urban Studies and City Management program** - the Aerial Traffic & Logistics Analysis System drone. These achievements confirm effectiveness of integrating scientific research. innovation. education. and strengthening AlmaU's position as a university that develops real tools to address today's urban challenges.

AlmaU Pop-Up Lab: **Students Explore the Urban Environment**

On April 6, 2025, Almaty Management University (AlmaU) held the Pop Up Lab AlmaU research event, combining a scientific approach, modern technologies, and real-life urban experience. The location was the "Terrenkur" café, located in one of Almaty's popular pedestrian areas. The project's main goal was to draw attention to urban environmental issues through the practical application of academic methods

Students in the "Urban Studies and City Management" program mapped the problems of the Terrenkur pedestrian zone, engaging residents in the process. Over 50 people were interviewed to identify points of comfort and discomfort in the urban environment. They wanted to demonstrate which tools can be useful studying urban objects-including infrastructure, buildings, public transportation, and other elements of the urban environment.

As part of the Neuro Lab AlmaU project, a study was conducted on restaurant menu perception using neuromarketing technologies. A large screen was installed at the entrance to the café, broadcasting in real time as a participant studied the menu using special eye-tracking glasses. Passersby could observe which menu elements-dish names, images, prices, or descriptions-the participant paid attention to. The participant was seated at a separate table and was obscured from the screen, ensuring their behavior remained natural.

The study involved 20 respondents, all residents of Almaty. Their behavioral responses allowed us to accurately capture how consumers interact with menus during the decision-making process.







«Green University» project

AlmaU implements the "Green University" project aimed at integrating ecological principles into everyday university life and The initiative seeks operations. environmental awareness and responsibility staff. engage students and community in sustainability activities, shape a new "green" image of the University. In addition, it enhances AlmaU's visibility through the organization of various environmental actions and educational campaigns.



As part of this initiative, AlmaU has introduced several measures to reduce plastic waste on campus. Tazalyk waste boxes are installed on the first floor and throughout different areas of the University, along with a plastic waste container near the parking lot. The University runs a partial recycling program, covering up to 20–25% of its total waste. Organic waste is recycled through open dumping and collaboration with agricultural farms, while plastic is collected in designated areas and transferred to city recycling facilities. Inorganic waste is processed through general state systems, and no toxic waste is produced. AlmaU partners with specialized recycling and utilization centers such as Tazalyk (plastic and paper), Samsung (batteries), Coca-Cola lcecek Kazakhstan, agricultural farms (organic food waste), and other organizations responsible for lamps and general waste management.

Following the workshop, AlmaU employees were able to ask Nadezhda questions, discuss environmental issues, and receive recommendations for maintaining a clean environment.

The team building event was aimed at both improving the environment and strengthening team spirit. As part of the event, AlmaU employees participated in a variety of games and recreational activities, allowing them to get to know each other better in a relaxed atmosphere.

Promoting Sustainable Development through Eco-Volunteer Projects

AlmaU is a socially responsible university that adheres to the goals of sustainable development and annually organizes environmental projects. Since 2019, an ice crossing has been taking place, the project "Uly Balkhash shakyrady" ("Great Balkhash Lake calls"), initiated and implemented by the GSB team, is aimed at preserving the nature and fauna of Lake Balkhash, which is the 15th largest lake in the world.

From March 1 to March 3, 2024, the first eco-volunteer project "Syr qorany - sekseýil" was held in the Kyzylorda region. The mission of this project is to restore the ecosystem of the region and protect it from the consequences of the ecological disaster of the Aral Sea. To achieve the goal of Almaty Management University attracted about 80 volunteers. The participants, with the support of the Ministry of Ecology and Natural Resources of the Republic of Kazakhstan, as well as local executive bodies, planted 5,100 saplings of saxaul on the bottom of the Aral Sea.







Advancing Environmental Sustainability through the "Green University" Initiative at AlmaU

The concept of the "Green and Safe Streets" project in Almaty can become a model for solving global systemic issues, such as climate change and air pollution, through the implementation of local initiatives. Green and Safe Streets is a program aimed at implementing measures to support the development of green and safe streets as part of a project funded by CEF and jointly implemented with local partners from the public sector to carry out a portfolio of urban transformations in Almaty. Creating green spaces that promote increased greenery and reduced carbon dioxide levels can have a positive impact not only on the local ecosystem but also on the global climate situation.

Furthermore, the project promotes systemic thinking, allowing residents to understand the interconnections between various aspects of urban life. The implementation of safe streets, considering the interests of pedestrians, cyclists, and public transport, contributes to the creation of more sustainable transportation systems and reduces dependence on cars. Active citizen participation in initiatives such as tree planting or creating community gardens strengthens the sense of community and allows people to realize how their actions affect broader ecosystems and the climate.

The project includes three development clusters:

- Social Impact Campaign a strategic initiative aimed at creating positive societal changes, whether it's raising awareness, changing behavior, or supporting a cause.
- Activation of Public Space (Tactical Urbanism) promoting environmental improvement, road safety, and the formation of an inclusive and barrier-free urban environment, focusing on city streets and vulnerable road users through pilot projects in tactical urbanism, workshops, and other activities aimed at involvement and participatory design.
- Air Quality Monitoring a strategic initiative aimed at creating positive societal changes, whether it's raising awareness, changing behavior, or supporting a cause.
